Making a Difference

- In August, we were in direct line of the derecho that came through Iowa resulting in mass destruction. Nearly everyone in our services and employees were impacted, leaving them without electricity for several days. In true P.I. fashion, everyone pulled together to make it through until power was restored. No one was injured and we recovered quickly with many individuals in services volunteering to help others recover from the storm.
- Through the Supported Employment program, P.I. supports over 100 people to obtain or maintain community employment. Of this number, 53 individuals are employed, with 30 individuals working 5 hours or more per week with an average hourly wage of \$9.18.
- P.I. provides 24-hour and hourly residential services for nearly 200 people who live in Newton, Des Moines and surrounding Iowa communities.
- P.I. received a three-year CARF accreditation (Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities) for the following programs: Community Employment Services: Employment Supports and Job Development, Community Housing, Community Integration and Supported Living. This is P.I.'s 14th consecutive three-year accreditation.
